



Hantavirus

What are Hantaviruses?

Hantaviruses are viruses in the Hantaviridae family, which infect rodents. Infected rodents can then infect humans.

Signs and Symptoms

The incubation period varies by disease type

Hemorrhagic Fever with Renal Syndrome symptoms include:

- Fever
- Lower back pain
- Hemorrhagic variations
- Renal involvement

Hantavirus Pulmonary Syndrome is another form of disease, though no cases have been recorded in the United States. Symptoms include:

- Fever
- Malaise
- Gastrointestinal issues
- Respiratory distress
- Hypotension

Transmission (How it spreads)

Likely through inhalation of aerosolized viral particles from rodent excrement

Diagnosis and Treatment

Tests can be done to determine if virus-fighting antibodies are found in the body

Treatment is limited to systematic and supportive care

Prevention:

Avoid handling of rodents

Who's At Risk?

Everyone; higher risk groups include:

- Rural residents who may come into contact with rodents
- Forestry workers
- Farmers
