Residential Curbside Recycling Within Riley County, Kansas

While there is voluntary separation of recyclables in Riley County, there is no common coordinated collection. Several private haulers offer curbside recycling and are listed on the quick reference chart.

Things to be aware of when recycling:

- No bags, all items must be loose in a container.
- Paper and cardboard must be dry and free of food debris.
- Tissues, paper towels or other paper that have been in contact with food is not acceptable.
- Make sure food contamination and lids are removed from cans and all containers are empty and rinsed.
- Separate plastic lids from plastic bottles (often made from different materials).
- Do not place medical waste (needles, catheters or lancets) into the recycling containers.

Acceptable Materials:

- Paper Products
 - Newspapers & inserts
 - Magazines & catalogs
 - Cardboard & clean empty pizza boxes (flattened into pieces not larger than 2x4 ft.)
 - Paper boxes (Cereal, cracker, pasta, tissue, shoe, gift, etc. (discard plastic liner and flatten)
 - Junk mail & home office paper
 - School papers, files, folders, etc.
 - All envelopes
 - Gift wrap
 - Plastic and Metal
 - Household cleaning supply containers (Emptied, rinsed & caps discarded. Labels are acceptable.)
 - Empty aerosol cans (No pesticide or spray paints!)
 - Aluminum, steel & tin cans
 - Milk cartons and drink boxes
 - #1-#7 plastic bottles (Emptied, rinsed & plastic lids removed)

Not Acceptable Materials:

- Batteries
- Carpeting
- Ceramics
- Clothing
- Electronic waste
- Fluorescent bulbs or tubes
- Food waste
- Foam Padding
- Mirrors

- Needles or syringes
- Oil cans
- Paint cans
- Contaminated paper
- Pesticide cans
- Plastic bags
- Rubber/Latex items
- Window Glass
- Yard Waste

Electronic Waste AKA E-Waste

The Riley County Board of County Commissioners accepted the recommendation of the Solid Waste Management Committee June 7, 2012 and approved Howie's Recycling as the County's recycler for electronic waste (E-waste). E-waste is no longer accepted at the Household Hazardous Waste Facility at 6245 Tuttle Creek Boulevard.

What is E-waste:

Electronic waste is anything with a plug or a circuit board.

Why is E-waste a problem?

- E-Waste contains toxic and hazardous materials such as lead, cadmium, beryllium, chromium, mercury and chemical flame retardants
- E-waste that ends up in landfills that contains heavy metals creates potential contamination to soil and groundwater
- Burning e-waste that contains brominated flame retardants generates toxic emissions
- CRT's (Cathode Ray Tube Monitors) found in old TV's and computer terminals contain 4-12 lbs. of lead

Do you know?

E-waste contains many valuable and recoverable materials such as aluminum, copper, gold, silver, plastics and ferrous metals.

This facility serves the Big Lakes Region which includes Clay, Dickinson, Geary, Marshall, Morris, Nemaha, Pottawatomie, Riley(Host County), Wabaunsee, and Washington counties.

This facility CANNOT accept controlled or narcotic substances, such as prescription painkillers like Percocet, or others like Xanax. If you cannot use this local household hazardous waste facility, then follow the Kansas Department of Health and Environment disposal recommendations listed below to prevent purposeful or accidental recovery of these medications.* Your local retail pharmacies support this water quality protection project.

Prepare excess medication as follows:

Crush or dissolve pills in water, coffee, or another liquid. Make a paste of the dissolved pills or liquid medication by adding it to kitty litter or coffee grounds. Put the paste in a closed container, making sure any personal markings are removed. Then put the closed container in the trash.
