History of the Veterans Oral History Project in Riley County

Interviews Available at Manhattan Public Library

Motivated by a desire to honor our nation's war veterans and to collect their stories while they are still with us, Congress created the VETERANS HISTORY PROJECT in October 2000. (Public Law 106-380). The act calls upon the American Folklife Center at the Library of Congress to collect and preserve audio and video-taped oral histories along with other material such as letters etc. It provides partnering structures between museums or libraries with other groups to create and preserve within communities a local collection of veteran's oral histories which is part of the national effort.

As part of this national effort, the Manhattan Sertoma Club, Jan McIntosh president, organized veteran interviews in Riley County from April 2001 through March 2002. Sertoma asked Glen Bussett to interview twelve World War II Veterans. The Manhattan Sertoma Club funded the expenses of this project as a pilot project to determine how a larger scale interview program might be conducted. Video taped interviews were made with the following: Edgar Bagley, Edna Bryant, Frank L. Bradley, Ceil Eyestone, Robin Higham, Richard L. Keller, Orris Kelly, Larry Norvell, Frank Orazem, Orlo Sorenson, Hugh Thompson, and Ruth Wells. Diane Soldan transcribed interviews with the following: Edgar Bagley, Frank Bradley, Cecil Eyestone, Richard Keller, Frank Orazem and Orlo Sorenson. The video tapes and transcripts are in the collection of the Riley County Historical Society at the Riley County Historical Museum.

While participating in a salute to veterans at the St. George Elementary Schools in the fall of 2002, Ken Visser heard about the Pottawatomie County veterans organizing to record such stories from individual veterans. Since Ken had some program responsibilities in the Flint Hills Veterans Coalition, he took opportunities to "talk up" this national effort in Riley County during the fall of 2002 and on into spring of 2003. With encouragement from other local veterans, Ken invited Dean Schoengerdt from Wamego to talk to interested Riley County veterans about his results in interviewing Pottawatomie County veterans.

Nine World War II Veterans from the Flint Hills Veterans Coalition met at the Riley County Historical Museum on June 12, 2003 and decided to go forward with an oral history program.. Ken Visser served as Chair of this group, Orris Kelly as Co-Chair, and Rosemary Visser served as Secretary. Bonnie Lenhart assisted Rosemary in her duties. Ron Frank provided technical expertise. Dick Jepson was Chair of the Finance Committee. Jim Sharp coordinated the interview process, Orris Kelly coordinated equipment needs, Cecil Eyestone and Burke Bayer organized a database of prospective interviewees and contacted them to determine their interest.

Bob Smail served as interview clerk; Jim Sharp, Ray Kurtz, John Lindholm, Ken Visser, and Ted Hodges were Captains of interview teams. Also working on the project as interviewers or cameramen were: Floyd Clark, Dana Dodderidge, Al Edwards, Diane Gaede, Alton Lee, William Johnson, Bill Lockhard, Ed Lindley, Milton Manual, John

Neil, Larry Parsons, Kent Smith and Verlyn Steinkruger. Also assisting with the project were Uteva Powers, Margaret Bickers, Richard Fulghem, Barbara Poresky, Cheryl Collins, Sandra Reddish and Karen Sisk. Joseph Chapes worked on the project in completion of his Eagle Scout award. Joe helped conduct interviews, organized help for interviews, and wrote and produced an instruction book for conducting interviews. The group's first interview was with Wayland Keefover on June 18, followed by the Ehlers brothers, Claus and Walter, who were in Kansas in July to attend the dedication of the Bob Dole Institute at KU in Lawrence. During the course of this project 192 interviews were made.

As part of the project, each veteran filled out information and permission forms. The veteran was interviewed and each veteran received a VHS tape of their interview. Two DVDs were also made, one DVD was placed in the collection of the Riley County Historical Society and one DVD was sent to the United States Library of Congress for inclusion in their Veterans Oral History archive.

Equipment for the project was provided by Ron Frank and the Riley County Historical Society and Museum. The camera used for the project was bought with funds donated in memory of Dell Gates by Anna Gates. The Riley County Commission provided the interview room in the Riley County Office Building East.

During the course of our project, Chair Ken Visser passed away. As a memorial to Ken, DVDs of those veterans who gave permission were placed in the Manhattan Public Library for check out. The interviews available for check out at the Manhattan Public Library are:
